## The James Como Collegiate Essay Contest

\$500 First Prize – \$300 Second Prize – \$200 Third Prize

The top five finalists will be publicized in the Society's bulletin and given a one-year membership to the New York C. S. Lewis Society, the first Lewis Society, founded in 1969.

### **Essay Content**

Essays should range from 2,000 – 5,000 words and pertain to a subject related to Lewis and his works. More weight will be given to essays that examine an in-depth topic in an original way. Some possibilities include, but are not limited to, a subject in Lewis's writings, or a genre, such as epic poetry or space fiction. Introductions, summaries, or broad overviews should be avoided. Also, well-covered topics, such as a basic analysis of "Sehnsucht," or longing for joy, will receive less weighting than others.

### **Submissions**

The contest is open to college students or those in alternative programs that promote the scholarship of English literature, rhetoric, philosophy, or theology.
